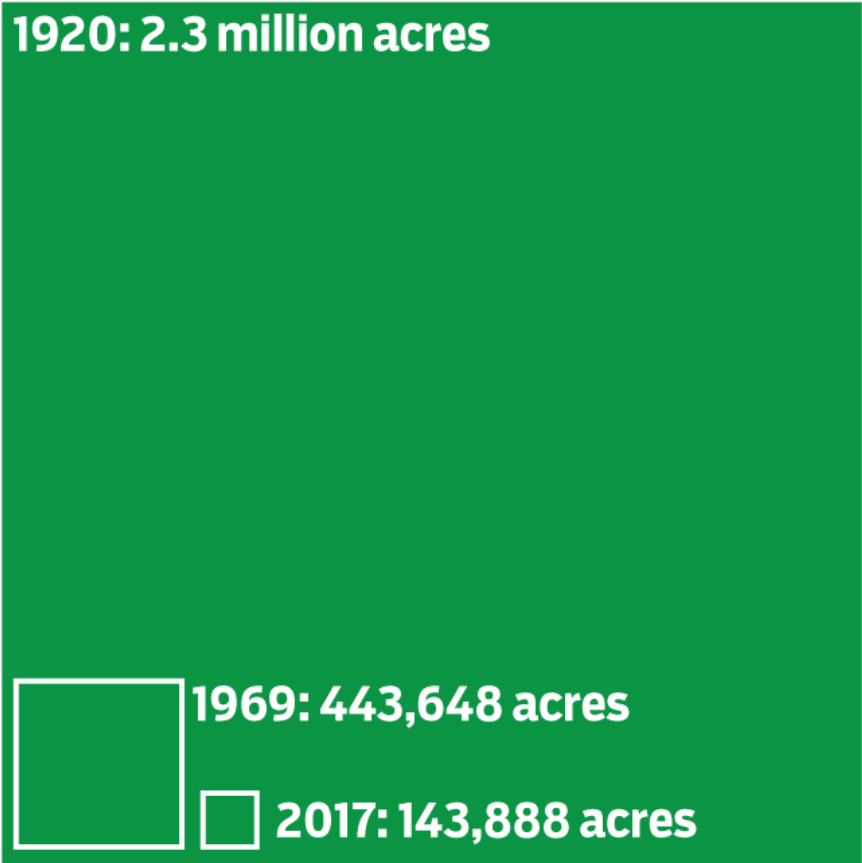


Virginia farmland operated by Black primary producers

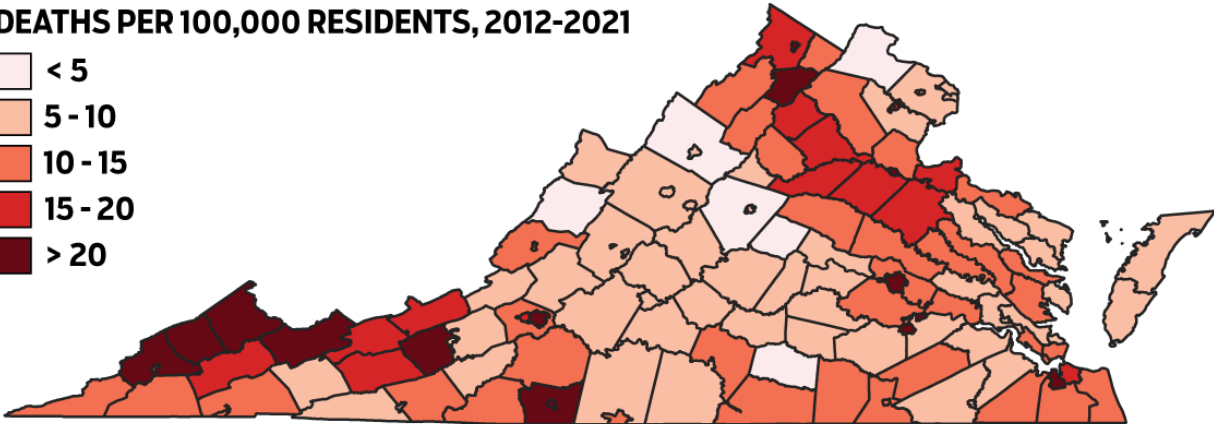

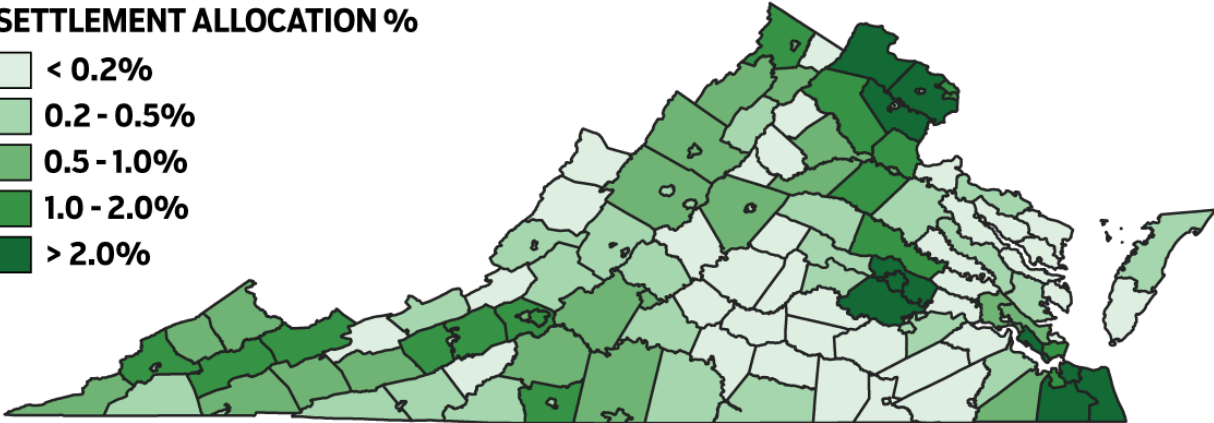

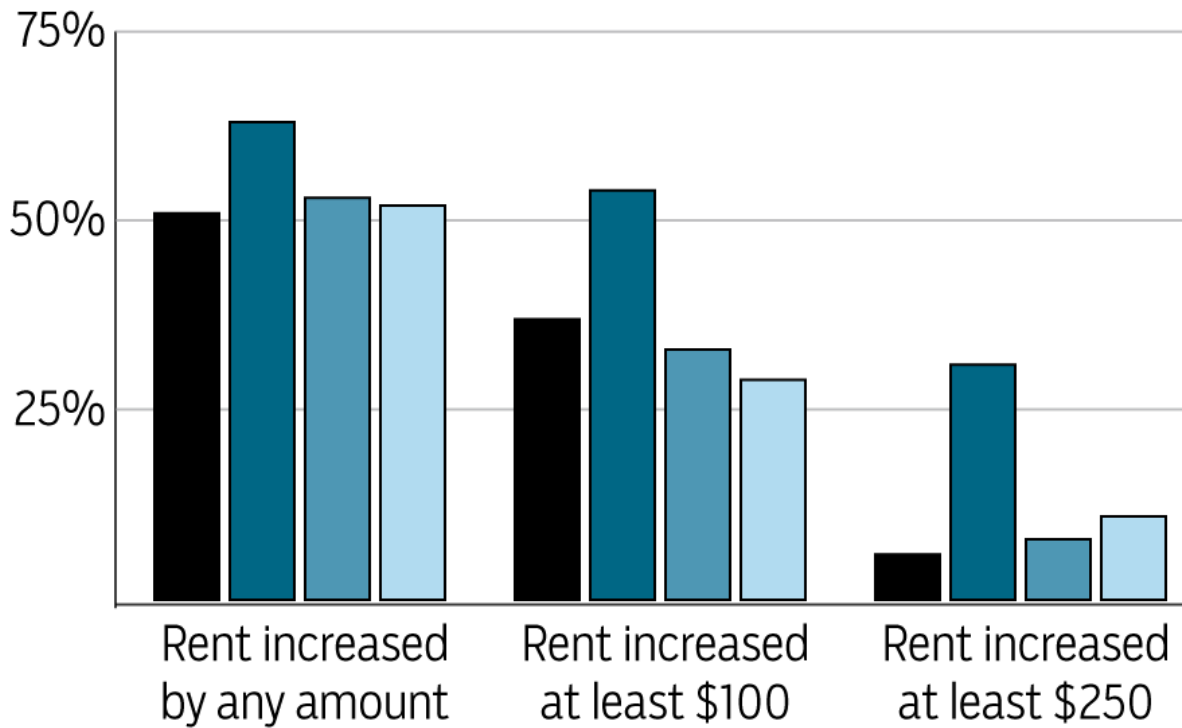
