In all, 4,150 toys, \$50 in gift cards and \$345 in cash were donated to Lake Christian Ministries.

Nancy and Rick Ellett of Sea Tow of SML, have been collecting toys for Lake Christian Ministries since 2009. For the past several years, Sea Tow has been spending four days in December outside four different Dollar General Store locations around the Lake with a small boat asking customers to bring or buy toys to fill the boat by the end of the day.

teers, helped process Sea Tow's hefty donation at Bethlehem United Methodist Church on Monday morning, "the need is incredible" this year.

Weiner said that during the Oct. 2-Nov. 29 registration period, 680 children were signed up, a significant increase from last year. She added that a large number are teenagers this year.

"The response has been huge this year," she said. "We had a total of 457 last year...I haven't seen anything like it."


She said that once all the LCM orders are filled, the remaining toys will be donated to We Care of Franklin County.
