COUNTY BUDGET

State spending standoff forces tough local choices, \$1 million gap

The county budget – normally long on detail and short on drama – has been yanked into an showdown over tax increases that promises a spring of debate and painful choices.

Rappahannock's proposed tax hikes, scheduled to be presented Wednesday evening by County Administrator Garrey Curry, are fueled by a winter standoff in the Virginia General Assembly.

The Republican-controlled House passed a budget bill featuring a \$1 billion tax cut endorsed by Governor Glenn Youngkin, while the Democratic-controlled Senate dropped the tax cut, but voted in new spending, partic-

Lawyer: Supervisor, fellow fire company, plaintiffs' attorney undermining county's efforts to revive station

A January Board of Supervisors


